## Committee on the Human Rights of Parliamentarians

## Forum of Young Parliamentarians of the IPU

On 7 April, the Forum will elect its Board.
According to Rule 5.3 of the Forum's Rules and Working Modalities: "The Board shall be composed of two representatives from each of the IPU geopolitical groups, a man and a woman".

All Geopolitical Groups are invited to submit two candidatures (one man and one woman) by 6 p.m. on Saturday, 6 April 2019 to the Submission and Control of Documents office.

## High-Level Advisory Group on Countering Terrorism and Violent Extremism

As decided by the Governing Council, the Group shall be composed of 21 members of national parliaments, nominated by their respective geopolitical groups on the basis of expertise and on the formula used for the composition of the Preparatory Committee of the Fifth World Conference of Speakers of Parliament (Executive Committee geopolitical group allocation plus one per group). ${ }^{2}$ The composition of the Group shall be gender balanced and the President of the Bureau of Women Parliamentarians and the President of the Board of the Young Parliamentarians shall be ex officio members. High-Level Advisory Group members shall serve for a single four-year term.

On 10 April, the Governing Council will elect 21 members, as follows:

Due to the specificities of this Bureau's work, it is recommended that candidates have a working knowledge of one of the two official IPU languages, English or French, and are able to travel for activities in the field and at UN Headquarters in New York.

Candidatures from the respective geopolitical groups, which may be submitted up until the time of the elections, should be accompanied by a brief curriculum vitae (maximum one page), specifying Committee membership in parliament and familiarity with the issues covered by the Committee, as well as the candidate's full contact details. The CV should also be accompanied by a commitment from the candidate's parliament that s/he will be supported in their work and included in future delegations to Assemblies.
