Today, more than ever before in human history, young people are in touch with each other and with their planet. As we know, we are fighting to save mankind from real extinction and we need the policymakers of this planet to reach this collective understanding. The climate has changed today, so we, as young parliamentarians, need the immediate adoption and implementation of climate policies around the world.
