MPs should actively engage with stakeholders involved in peace initiatives, such as government agencies, civil society organizations, international partners and local communities. By fostering dialogue and collaboration, MPs can facilitate coordination among different actors, address implementation challenges, and ensure that diverse perspectives are considered.

Parliamentarians can also advocate for adequate financial and human resources to support the implementation of peace initiatives.
