These platforms have become important mechanisms for constructive discussion of regional issues.

It should be emphasized that thanks to the joint efforts of the Central Asian countries, it is possible to find fundamental solutions to issues of regional cooperation. Today, the political situation in the region has undergone a dramatic positive transformation.
